As per Government of Maharashtra's G.R. dated 3rd July, 1995, 24th June 1996 and 28th June 2009 (available on Directorate's website) there is a provision for special educational concession to the wards of displaced citizens and wards of officers and staff of military and paramilitary forces posted to combat terrorists activities in Jammu & Kashmir state which is now Union territory of Jammu Kashmir and Union Territory of Ladakh.

The last date to avail this concession for courses under Directorate of Higher Education is August 15, 2020 for academic year 2020-21. 



READ: Government Resolution, Higher & Technical Education and Employment Department No. TEM 8095/ 9206/ (6875)/ TE.1, dated 3.7.1995.

RESOLUTION : Normal civic life and public order have been seriously affected due to terrorist activities in the State of Jammu and Kashmir. Quite a large number of people in the State have been displaced and have sought shelter with their relatives in other parts of the country or in the rehabilitation camps. The social and economic life of these people has been considerably disrupted with the result that their children have been considerably handicapped in pursuing their studies and preparing for examinations. Similarly, quite a large number of officers and such of the military and paramilitary forces have been deployed in the State of Jammu and Kashmir to combat terrorists activities. These officers and staff have to discharge onerous duties against odds. Such officers and staff as well as officers belonging to I.A.S., I.P.S., I.F.S. and other similar cadres posted in Jammu and Kashmir have been facing difficulties in continuing education of their children. Hence, Government of Maharashtra has extended special educational concession to the wards of displaced citizens and to the children of officers and staff posted to combat terrorists activities for admission in the field of Engineering, Pharmacy, Architecture both at degree and diploma level and also in Arts, Science, Commerce, Education and Law for the year 1995-96, vide Government Resolution, Higher and Technical Education and Employment Department No. TEM 8095/ 9206/ (6875)/ TE.1 dated 3.7.1995. The question of extending similar concession in future was under consideration of Government.

2. Government is now pleased to direct that facilities for higher education in the field of Engineering, Pharmacy, Architecture both at degree and diploma level, MBA/MMS and also in Arts, Science, Commerce, Education and Law will continue until further orders.

3. In order to be eligible for admission to these courses, the students ought to fulfil the prescribed minimum eligibility criterion as laid down in the admission rules.

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4. One seat per course, over and above the sanctioned intake capacity of all educational institutions, under the control of Higher & Technical Education Department, is hereby permitted to be created in every Government, aided and non-aided diploma as well as degree level institutions. These seats cannot be allotted to any candidates other than those mentioned above.

5. The candidates seeking admission in Engineering, Pharmacy, Architecture both at degree and diploma level and MBA/MMS courses shall apply in own handwriting, in the prescribed printed proforma on or before the last date specified by the Directorate of Technical Education, 3 Mahapalika Marg, Dhobi Talao, Mumbai, 400 001. The application forms will be available on payment from the distribution centres notified. The application for any other courses shall be on their paper and submitted to Secretary, Higher and Technical Education, Mantralaya Annexe, Mumbai - 400 032. The requisite documents accompanying the applications for admission have been indicated in Annexure A.

6. The candidates may use the application forms same as prescribed by the Government which will be made available to them at a special concessional rate of Rs.10/-. These forms will be made available only in the offices of Deputy Directors of Technical Education, Mumbai, Pune, Nasik, Aurangabad, Nagpur and Amravati only on the production of certificate of being Kashmiri migrant. However, if candidates use other forms the difference in the cost will not be refunded.

INTRODUCTION: Normal civic life and public order have been seriously affected due to terrorist activities in the State of Jammu & Kashmir. Quite a large number of people in the State have been displaced and have sought shelter with their relatives in other parts of the country or in the rehabilitation camps. The social and economic life of these people has been considerably disrupted with the result that their children have been considerably handicapped in ^{their studies} ~~their studies~~. Similarly, quite a large number of officers and such of the military and para-military forces have been deployed in the State to combat terrorists' activities. These officers and staff have to discharge onerous duties against heavy odds. Children of such officers and staff and also all officers belonging to Indian Administration Service and Indian Police Service posted in Jammu and Kashmir have been facing difficulties in continuing their education. Fortunately, adequate facilities are available in Maharashtra in the field of engineering, pharmacy, architecture, arts, science, commerce, education etc. The question of extending assistance to the above categories of students has been under the consideration of this Government for sometime past.

RESOLUTION

2. Government is now pleased to direct that the facilities for Higher Education in the field of engineering, pharmacy, architecture, both at degree and diploma level as also Arts, Science, Commerce Education and Law will be provided to children of citizens displaced due to terrorists' activities. From Jammu & Kashmir as also children of officers belonging to Indian Administration Service, Indian Police Service and other officers and staff belonging to military and para-military forces transferred to Jammu & Kashmir to deal with terrorists' activities.

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In order to be eligible for admission to these courses, the students ought to fulfil the prescribed minimum educational qualifications laid down by the State Government and/or Universities. So far as the admission to Diploma/Degree Courses in Engineering, Pharmacy, Architecture etc. the candidates should have secured at least 50% marks in Physics, Chemistry, Maths taken together at one and the same sitting (45% marks in the subject of physics, chemistry, maths. taken together at one and same sitting for B.C. candidates). Admission to other courses of higher Education will be effected on the basis of the condition regarding minimum educational qualifications prescribed by the respective Universities in the State.

In order to accommodate the eligible students for admission to different courses in the field of Higher and Technical Education, one seat per course over and above the sanctioned intake capacity is hereby permitted to be created in every Government, Aided and Non-Aided Diploma/Degree level institutions. These seats cannot be allotted to any students other than those mentioned above. The applications for admission should be addressed on plain paper to Secretary Higher & Technical Education Department (Kashmir Cell), 4th Floor, Mantralaya, Bombay-400 032 and submitted by post on or before 15th July 1995 at the latest. Applications received thereafter will not be entertained. ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~ ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~ The requisite documents accompanying the applications for admission have been indicated in Annexure-I. Applicant may indicate choice of college/courses and the allotment shall be strictly on merit-cum-preference basis. Personal inquiries will not be entertained and allotment, once made shall be final. - 2) School/Institution Leaving (after qualifying examination) certificate.
- 3) Certificate of marks obtained at S.S.C. or its equivalent examination.
- 4) For Govt. servants or persons serving in Military or para-Military Service/ from the Head of Department/ University where they are serving. ✓
- 5) Those staying in migrant/refugee camps and those who are registered with Govt. as migrant should submit certificate from the officer in charge of Migrant/Refugee Camp.
- 6) Displaced persons staying with relatives/friends anywhere in the country other than in refugee camps should enclose a certificate from the District Magistrate of the district where they are staying to the effect that the parents/guardians of the candidate is a displaced person from Jammu & Kashmir due to recent disturbances (1990 onwards).

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Certificate
